EXECUTIVE PRIORITIES

Transportation, Infrastructure & Housing

- Full funding and enhanced appropriations for Capitol Investment Grants to support Project Connect
- Secure funding for Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) Grants
- Support discretionary grant funding for IH-35 capital express "Cap and Stitch" Project
- Increased funding for Homeless Assistance Grants and enhancement of the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit

Education, Talent and Workforce

- Fund schools, close achievement gaps and support greater alignment between K-12, higher education and labor demand
- Streamline the FAFSA application process and increase the Pell grant to help students afford higher education
- Extend work-study to in-demand apprenticeships, internships and work-based learning programs
- Support pre-apprenticeship and apprenticeship programs for high-paying industries
- Support meaningful immigration reform that includes a pathway to citizenship and federal locality pay reform to give employers access the world's best talent

Economic Development, Innovation and National Security

- Support swift implementation of the CHIPS And Science Act and targeted investments in Central Texas' semiconductor industry
- Advance The American Innovation and Jobs Act (S. 866/H.R. 2673) which restores the full and immediate deduction of R&D expenditures
- Modernize and strengthen programs within the Economic Development Administration (EDA)

Healthcare

- Support Bipartisan Resident Physician Shortage Reduction Act (S. 834/H.R. 2256) to address growing physician shortage in Central TX
- Secure one of the available ARPA-H hubs in Dallas, an effort that is supported by Austin, San Antonio and Fort Worth
- Lower the cost of prescription drugs and expand Telehealth availability
